Position Description Referee Director

The Referee Director is responsible for the human resource planning, recruiting, selection, training and recognition of Eastern Suburbs Touch Association Referees.

Responsible to

The Referee Director is directly responsible to the Technical Director of Eastern Suburbs Touch Association and the members of Eastern Suburbs Touch Association.

Responsibilities and duties

The Referee Director should:

- Assess the refereeing needs for the club for general running and special events
- Recruit and recommend the appointment of Referees to roles that suit them
- Organise the orientation, accreditation and the induction of Referees
- Assess and coach referees within the club
- Organising Referees rosters and maintaining records
- Identify and organise the training and education opportunities for Referees (Level 1 to Level 6 pathways)
- Ensure all referees are recognised for their efforts
- Submit regular reports to the club committee
- Liaise with the regional and state referee panels
- Drive the promotion of club referees to regional and state representative appointments

Knowledge and skills required

Ideally a Referee Director is someone who:

- Can communicate effectively and has good interpersonal skills
- Is positive and enthusiastic
- Is well organised
- Has an education in accredited Referee Coaching
- Has an understanding of the judicial processes
- Has Talent Referee (Level 3) accreditation or higher

Time commitment required

The estimated time commitment required as the Referee Director of Eastern Suburbs Touch Association is 3 hours per week.
